- Having seen Kret No. NS/RKT/0704/124 dated July 15, 2004 on the appointment of the Royal Government of Cambodia.
- Having seen Kram No. 02/NS/94 dated July 20, 1994 on the organization and functioning of the Council of Ministers
- Having seen Kram No. NS/RKM/0196/01 dated on January 24, 1996 on the establishment of the Ministry of Education of Youth and Sport,
- Upon the proposition of the Prime Minister of Royal Government of Cambodia and Minister of the Ministry of Education of Youth and Sport,

Promulgate;

The Law on the approval for the Kingdom of Cambodia to participate in International Convention on Prevention of Dopamine uses in the field of sport, adopted by National Assembly on November 27, 2006 during the 5<sup>th</sup> session of the third legislature, and entirely approved by the Senate of its form and legal concepts on December 25, 2006 during the 2<sup>nd</sup> senate plenary meeting of the second legislature, the text of which appears as below:

**Article 1:**

Approve for the Kingdom of Cambodia to participate in International Convention on  
Prevention of using Dopamine in the Field of Sport which was held in Paris on October 19,  
2005 by attaching the whole text with.

**Article 2:**

Royal Government of Cambodia shall continue legal procedure to implement this  
International Convention.

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International Convention on  
the Prevention of Dopamine Uses in the Field of Sport

Copenhagen Declaration  
on the Prevention of Dopamine Uses in the Field of Sport

**Participants:**

- Having understood that the sport plays important role in health prevention, morality education, and physical education, and promote the understanding internationally.
- Having been careful on the use of Dopamine and its harmfulness to the value of the sport.
- Having been worried about the uses of the agents and methods of the using Dopamine by the athlete through sport, and side effects caused by the uses of those substances and the methods which may harm to the future of the sport.
- Having seen the law, policy, and Declaration against the use of Dopamine which have been approved by National and International Sport Institution.
- Having known that the public authority and sport institution shall be responsible for each other in preventing the use of Dopamine in the field of sport, especially to ensure the proper functioning in sport event, based on the basic principle of equal participation and to protect the athletes' health who participate in the sport event.
- Having recognized the progress made by the Royal Government against the use of Dopamine until today, especially related to the recognition of the governance and fund provision to the global agency against the use of Dopamine, the establishment and implementation of the board of European convention against the use of Dopamine(ETS 135) and additional protocol of this board, intergovernmental cooperation against the use of Dopamine, including the participation of international intergovernmental board on the forum against the use of Dopamine in the field of sport (IICGDS) and the establishment of national program against the use of Dopamine.
- Having recognized the Final Communiqué of the round table meeting of UNESCO of the Minister and High-ranking officials in charge of the Physical Education and Sport which was held in Paris, on January 9<sup>th</sup> until 10<sup>th</sup> 2003, supporting the organization of International Convention against the use of Dopamine as soon as possible based on the Convention against the use of Dopamine of the European board by the 2004 summer Olympic and for the approval if possible, by the 2006 winter Olympic.
- Having committed to implement the additional cooperation activities and more serious with the aim of reducing and finally eliminating the use of Dopamine in the field of sport.
- This leads to the understanding as below:

**1- Scope:**

In order to implement according to all of the paragraphs of this Declaration, the participants shall obey to the scope of the regulation of the National Constitution of their countries respectively and other regulation, and shall recognize the differences in National Constitution System and Law among other government included with various methods in order to prevent the Dopamine uses in the field of sport.

**2- Objective:**

The objective of this Communiqué is to disseminate the understanding of the policy and morality among the participants to:

2.1 Recognize the roles and support the global agency against the use of Dopamine (WADA)

2.2 Support the global law against the use of Dopamine, "Law" which is approved by Fund Committee WADA at the World Conference on the Dopamine uses in the field of sport (Copenhagen, March 3 to 5, 2003).

2.3 Sustain the international intergovernmental cooperation in order to encourage the coordination in policy and practices against the use of Dopamine in the field of sport, and

2.4 Support to the procedure in a timely manner which leads to convention or other obligation on 3-8 as hereunder and which shall implement via instrument in conformity to the National Constitution context and administration of each government on the day or by the first day of Winter Olympic in Turin. This procedure shall use the specialized skill of governmental representative from all regions in the world and international organization.

**3- The Support on WADA:**

Each participant:

3.1 Recognize the roles and support to WADA

3.2 Shall be under modification of the intergovernmental cooperation which is appropriate, and disseminate their purpose to continue routine of practice that the

public authority has implemented accordance to governance and the fund provision to WADA and under this frame:

3.2.1 Support to the appointment of the membership of the Delegation of public authority in the fund committee WADA according to Olympic regions:

- 4 Representatives from American Continent
- 3 Representatives from African Continent
- 5 Representatives from European Continent
- 4 Representatives from Asian Continent
- 2 Representatives from Oceania Continent

3.2.2 Support on the fund provision to WADA by the public authority and Olympic movement as below:

3.2.2.1 Public Authority contributes 50% of annual core budget of WADA which has been approved.

3.2.2.2. The disbursement of Public Authority to WADA based on the Olympic regions:

- Africa: 0.50%
- America: 29%
- Asia: 20.46%
- Europe: 47.5%
- Oceania: 2.54%

#### **4- The support to the Universal Law Against the use of Dopamine:**

Each participant:

4.1 Recognize the roles of the law as a basic of universal and preventing of Dopamine use in the field of sport.

4.2 Wherever appropriate, the policy and routine of practice shall be better amended against the use of Dopamine in the field of sport in the conformity to the regulation.

4.3 Encourage national and international institutions concerning to the prevention of Dopamine use in the field of sport to adopt the law and to function in conformity to the law wherever appropriate.

4.4 Take appropriate measures on the refusal to accepting any partially or fully financial support of any government participated in sport events from specific sport organization, athletes and athlete's sponsor which is not abide to the law or having preventing measures on the use of Dopamine which is currently enforces to the enacted law, and

4.5 Support to the roles of WADA in coordination, alignment and efforts against the use of Dopamine according to the existing law.

**5- Measures on Controlling of Possession of, Using of and Prohibited Method in sport:**

5.1 Each participant shall ensure the regulation, administrative measures, and other relevant measures of executive body are in place in order to:

5.1.1. Monitor on the (importation, exportation, distribution, smuggling and production) of substance and prohibited method, and

5.1.2 Encourage the communication and information in order to reduce any Dopamine substance and prohibited method among other agency within their jurisdiction.

In doing so, measures implemented shall not obstruct to any possession of substance and prohibited method in sport for serving legal purpose.

5.2 Each participant shall be encouraged to have other measures related to the uses of supplement nutrition in order to raise awareness among the athletes on the choice of other nutrition to avoid the Dopamine uses which have been prohibited.

**6- National Measures against the Use of Dopamine:**

Each participant shall provide financial aids by his/her own means to support the National Program against the use of Dopamine which include control measures on the use of Dopamine, educational activities, research and dissemination of information.

**7- International Cooperation on the Control of the Dopamine Use:**

Having recognized that the control of Dopamine use in the field of sport is the only effective method in which the test can be done on the athlete without informing in advance and obtaining the specimen upon the body sample collection which can be timely sent to the laboratory for analysis. Therefore, each participant shall:

7.1 Collaborate with WADA organization and organization working against the use of Dopamine, which operate under the sponsor of WADA organization, and shall obey to the law and regulation of their respective country, and shall take measure on the Dopamine uses for their athletes, whether it is at their own territory or elsewhere.

7.2 Whenever appropriate, shall collaborate in sending or transferring the specimen across the border upon the body sample is collected.

7.3 Whenever appropriate, shall recognize the legal procedures on controlling the substance use and managing the testing result of the organization working against the use of Dopamine, and acting in the conformity to the law.



7.4 Whenever appropriate, shall collaborate with WADA organization in coordinate internationally on the control measure of the Dopamine use which have been implemented by the organization working against the other substance uses, and

7.5 Encourage and support to the testing procedures made by government or non-governmental organization against the use of Dopamine substance, whom have been appointed.

**8- Monitoring on the Implementation:**

The monitoring on continuing to abide to this agreement, other commitment and obligation in this convention shall be made as what have been determined in the discussion between WADA organization and other concerned government.

**9- Transition:**

During the time which led to the establishment of a convention or other obligation, all participants shall ask WADA organization for collaboration based on actual circumstance to help to implement regulation of this law according to government competency.
